

If you read through the headings in Acts 17-28, you'll see the places where the gospel was preached by Paul, starting with Thessalonica and finishing in Rome. In some places the good news about Jesus brought about serious discussion, for example, in Corinth. In other places it caused riots! Paul's journey to Rome is almost unbelievable but in this final week of our Journey through Acts let's have a look at what happened by reading some Bible verses & completing the activities..


If you want... you can read the whole story in Acts 27 & 28

Acts 27:1 It was decided that Paul would set sail for Rome. An officer named Julius, guarded Paul and some other prisoners

Acts 27: 5-6 They came to the city of Myra. There the office found a ship that was going to Italy. So Paul was put on it.



<<< Do you know the colours of the flag of Italy?


Acts 27:7 They sailed slowly for many days. And had a hard time because the wind was blowing against them.

Acts 27:14-15 A very strong wind then came and carried the ship away

Acts 27:20-21 For many days the storm they couldn't see the sun or the stars. The storm was so bad. They lost all hope of surviving it.

Acts 27:22 + 24 Paul told the men... 'Cheer up! None of you will die! But the ship will be wrecked. God has given you this promise to save you. I trust in Him'

Acts 27:37 There were 276 people on the ship

Acts 27:41 The ship hit a sandbank. The front of the ship stuck there and could not move. Then the big waves began to break the back of the ship to pieces.


“The big waves broke the ship into pieces.”

Acts 27:43 - 8:1 Everyone had to swim to land or use wood piece from the ship to float to safety. When safe on land we learned that the island was called Malta. The people of Malta were very good and looking after those shipwrecked and made them a fire.

Acts 28:10 + 16 They stayed in Malta for 3 months. Then they arrived in Rome. Paul was allowed to live in a house but a soldier stayed with him to guard him.

Acts 28:23-24 Paul told the Jews in Rome all day long about God and he tried to persuade them to believe the things about Jesus. Some believed and some didn't.

Acts 28:30-31 Paul stayed 2 full years in his house. He welcomed people who came to visit him. He preached about the kingdom of God and taught about the Lord Jesus Christ. He was very bold, and no-one tried to stop him.



Paul's time in house arrest was used for God's glory because during this time Paul wrote letters to churches and individuals that are part of our Holy Bible that thousands and thousands read across the world
